Greetings,

So we're three years into our time here at Grace, and in case you haven't noticed, I'm a little bit of a John Wesley nerd. I caution myself to not put him so high up on a pedestal that I make his words like Biblical canon, but I certainly admire the fervor in which he lived, the passion in

which he preached, and the ways he navigated the challenges of faith and living a holy life. One of the blessings for us as we look back on our history is that Wesley journaled all the time, and I mean ALL the time. We have great records of all the ministry happenings of the early Methodists as well as insights as to what was going on in John's mind. Through his sermons on his journal writings we have quite a few gems that have come from him that can provide significant wisdom to our lives. Some of my favorite are:

- \sim Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can.
- ~ Whosoever will reign with Christ in heaven, must have Christ reigning in him on earth.
- ~ Though we cannot think alike, may we not love alike? May we not be of one heart, though we are not of one opinion? Without all doubt, we may.
- ~ I learned more about Christianity from my mother than from all the theologians in England. (John was kind of a mama's boy!)

These are just a few from the vast amount of writings we have. However, there is one that I find quite prudent to our present time and it has been stirring in my soul lately. "We should be rigorous in judging ourselves and gracious in judging others."

I think within the Christian life we get caught up in thinking about bringing about the Kingdom of God by transforming the world that we are so quick to skip over transforming our own hearts. The pattern is all too common in most areas of our life including the church, politics, relationships, etc.; I see something needing to be changed in someone else's life and it's far easier to point that out than it is to work on my own junk/garbage/whatever other word you'd like to enter here. We become quick to give ourselves grace (I'm not saying beat yourself up by any means, we all need grace!), but then don't pass that grace

along to others.

Friends, it must start with us. Wesley's quote is two-fold here and fits into our understanding of the means of grace, remember acts of piety and acts of mercy? We ought to be rigorous in our judging ourselves in our devotional life, our worship habits, our prayers, our spiritual disciplines. Are we doing all we can to grow in our love and understanding of God through reading and meditating upon scripture, emptying

ourselves of worldly desires through fasting and solitude? I know my schedule gets busy quickly and I end up ignoring those things. That's when it becomes easier to heap judgement upon someone else rather than grace. If we are not diligent, and even rigorous in these things, our acts of mercy become shallow at best. In our Facebook Discipleship group we are going to be looking at the book, *Sacred Rhythms* by Ruth Haley Barton, that helps to pattern our life in a way that not only adds in these disciplines, but we build a lifestyle around our devotion to God. Even if you haven't joined that group yet, please do! You are more than welcome to follow along on your own as well.

As we wind down summer and approach our fall schedules with school, activities, and more, may we be gracious in our judgement of others, knowing that the grace given to us by God is not meant to be stored up in our hearts, but distributed to all we encounter. May God be with you in all you do!



Let God Be The Pilot of Your Life Del Larson, CLM

It is always amazing how God guides my writing. Whether writing newsletter articles, caregiver suggestions, or any project. God is in control. Now, if I can get you to believe that, just imagine the work that God can do in your life. I have shared numerous stories on "God Whispers" or "God Taps", yet I'm going to share one more, according to what God is telling me tonight, July 16. Usually, I know what to write but not this time.

Luann made the decision back in January, when I was having serious health problems, and after much discussion and prayer, that it might be better for her to move into assisted living rather than wait for something to happen to one or both of us, and then not have the choice. This would be her move alone. I believe that if I moved with her, I would not stop being her primary caregiver, and continue to risk my health and abilities. Second, the cost would delete my retirement in 3.5 years. Last, I want to be there, if God agrees, for the finish of Luann's life journey. This is not a decision everyone can make.

In early May, I told my online caregiving group our plans for Luann moving. At our next meeting two weeks later, 3 of the 6 said they too were now looking at doing the same. Last month, I visited my 93 old high school English teacher who had fallen and broken his hip. He was trying to save his wife from falling. They lived in assisted living, but she now lives in memory care. He told me he'd do it again, if he knew it would help his wife. As he stands in the back and watches, she is now talking to other residents, rather than looking for him for words or directions. He says he loves to listen to her talk again. God turned a challenge into an opportunity to see things from a different perspective. What a marvelous change it turned out to be. Luann's situation has also turned out better than we expected. She is in love with the facility, staff, residents, and the activities. After being there less than a week, I was visiting her and walked with her to supper. I told her I would come back afterwards and we could watch a movie. Oh, no she said, "I've got bingo tonight!" What a positive response for both of us. I didn't expect this to happen so soon. Thank you Lord for guiding us to make this decision!

What is it that you are struggling with? Finances, politics, job, family, health?

I have been worried about my finances this month with all the things Luann needed for her apartment. However, I noticed this week that my property tax rebate, which I had forgotten, showed up just in the nick of time. Is that not God working.

I'm so tired and sad of the politics and the hatred that is overtaking our country. Customer Service is a thing of the past. Rent and housing continue to go up, and services go down. My adult children and grandchildren struggle with their families. Each of them have kids with health issues. Although there are jobs available, some aren't paying enough to pay the rent or cover the expense. As I look back, I thought we had it tough. I worked 3 jobs in college. **However**, as I look back, I see how God has been instrumental in my life and my success. There is no doubt in my mind, that when God put Luann and I together, he had a purpose. She gave up her college, so I could finish, and now I've been her caregiver for 25 years. I know God was instrumental in my success, and the number one reason is Luann.

When I lost my teaching job, God had a job lined up in Milbank, SD, as a hardware manager. Two years later, I was back in Moorhead teaching again. That business job made me a better teacher and leader. When Luann had to quit working, it took years before she got her disability for MD. We survived because God made it happen. Everything we have done and accomplished has been because God put us in the right spot at the right time. The same goes for you. Perhaps you need to change your perspective? An hour ago, I started this article. God has guided me to finish it so quickly, to show you how He works. I am so thankful that I have learned to trust God, and let Him be the pilot. Take a moment and think back how often God has been your guide and you didn't realize it. Amen!
