Our son started playing team soccer a few weeks ago, and as excited as he was to play, I was even more excited to watch! I have all sorts of memories growing up and playing soccer in a jersey that was just a little too big while seven other five year olds tried to all kick the ball at the same time. We had practiced all week on dribbling, passing, and shooting, so he felt confident and ready to go. Monday night rolls around and it's game time folks! It was pretty easy to see right away that our team was going to be out-

matched, the other kids were bigger, faster, and seemed to have more experience in general. Dexson had a good time overall, but I could tell he was feeling defeated. Afterwards we were talking and he said to me, "the other team was just too fast and too big." I've always been on the smaller size so I know exactly how he was feeling, and thought

I'd share a nugget of wisdom I had to take to heart growing up. I said, "buddy, there will always be someone bigger and faster, so make sure no one on that field tries harder than you." He's four, so I'm not sure exactly how much that sunk in, but it's something I hope he learns early.

One of our Certified Lay Speakers, Diana Stead, preached a powerful sermon recently about how we build up our faith. She mentioned the different parts of life we're dealing with that hold us

back from building our faith, one of them being envy. I could tell Dex had some envy about how big and fast those other kids were. When it comes to our faith and participation in what God is doing, I worry that we do the same thing. "Well I don't pray as well as that person," or, "I can't serve like they can," and we so easily feel defeated and think we have nothing to offer. Luckily for us, God sees things differently than we do.

We're reminded in scripture that God doesn't look at how big and fast we are, how big our of-

fering is, or measure us against any other physical standard. When anointing the next king of Israel, Samuel looked at Jesse's sons and was looking for the most rugged and strong, the biggest and the fastest, but God kept passing. 1 Samuel 16:7 says, "But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward

appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." Certainly our effort and heart ought to produce fruit. But it's important we don't get hung up on how "big and fast" others are, and continue to put our whole heart into growing in faith, loving God and neighbor, and serving those who God has placed in our path.

HAVE YOU BEEN REBORN IN CHRIST?

It's that time of year with all the seasonal changes. It's also time to check our faith status. From a devotional the other night, the topic of being "reborn" was the focus. I thought, "I have been reborn," but I asked God to show me what I needed to do to hold that claim. Our goal should be to get closer to God, to get that ticket to eternity. As I read this study from Oswald Chambers, I started to question, just what does it really mean to be reborn, and how can you keep it? We are sinful by nature and always will be, but by being reborn into Christ, will we be closer to God? The answer is **YES!** Being reborn is "a spiritual enlightenment and transformation causing a person to lead a new life in Christ." First, we need to undergo a meaningful spiritual change. We must intentionally put God first in our lives, and make an internet speed connection with Him. To become "Christ-like" is a 24/7 commitment.

This change means we are seeking to get rid of our old ways that hinder us from entering the Kingdom of God. If we are honest with ourself, we already know what these hindrances are. They're fairly easy to recognize. What are the things we are doing now that are not pleasing to God. What actions, thoughts, words, or attitude is not "Christ like?" Is God our first priority? That's how our ticket gets punched. Now, my mind is spinning, and my heart is racing as I contemplate this rebirth.

God can't mean changing all the fun stuff can he? It's a beautiful weekend and we want to be at the lake. It's OK, go and enjoy! This is part of God's miracle of creation. How can we include God in that fun? Can we take time to watch the online service and worship with Him? Did we remember to praise God and thank Him for the beautiful day, and the gifts of fun we enjoy? We need to be intentional in our relationship. Everything is about God. It is important to remember who is in control, and who is responsible for the gifts we enjoy.

Perhaps we are on the golf course ready to play a round. Do we recognize the gift of the ability to play golf, or to afford golf? Stop and ask yourself, what did I do that was Christ-like today? Can't think of anything? That's OK. Think back over the past week. Anything there? For me, it is sometimes easier to remember the things I could have done, rather than the things I actually did. How about you? Did you realize God was speaking to you, when you remembered what you should have done? To be "Reborn" again, is to focus on the Spirit and seek a change of heart, by putting God first in all you do.

Characteristics of Born again Christians: • They speak the truth at all times. • They are good listeners. • They hardly take offense. • They are quick to forgive. • They are reliable. • They are supportive. • They have an appetite for prayer and fasting. • They rely on the Word of God. • The more God lifts them up, the more they connect and see eternity.

We will still continue to sin, because we can only be "like" Christ. What is amazing is how you start to recognize God is connecting with you to help you avoid sin, and to remind you when you fail. When you are connected with God, you are seeking a transformation, a rebirth with Him. You soon realize life becomes easier, and sinful ways slowly disappear. God's whispers and visions are clearer. He wants to help you grow into a stronger Christian.

How is faith like a pasture or grasslands? Even when you are trampled, eaten, and infested, the roots with God remain strong and bound together, no matter what happens. Sounds exactly what I need. How about you? It's time for a rebirth! Amen
