Greetings:

My favorite month of the year is upon us! There really is so much to love about October, isn't there? Apple orchards, and pumpkin patches, football and soup, Halloween, leaves changing color, I could go on and on. October is big in our household for all those reasons plus two birthdays, Dex and I share the 11th together. It can be tempting to let the calendar fill up with events and wonderful activities and let it all slip by so fast. As I often write about in these newsletters, perhaps this would be a helpful reminder to slow down and take it all in, be present even when it's busy, and be sure to pay attention to how God is working through each moment of your life.

One such moment occurred for me during youth group a few weeks ago. Our lesson was planned around taking time to find silence in a noisy world. Many of us struggle either making space in our schedule to have quiet time with God or even struggle with the silence itself. We talked about Elijah hearing God not in the wind, earthquake, or fire, but in the still silence. Part of the activity was having an opportunity for a quiet "stress heave". Students took sticky notes and wrote down what was stressing them out, and were reminded to listen to what God was speaking to them as they wrote it down. They then posted the sticky notes on the wall, having the opportunity to see that they weren't alone in their struggles. Walking around after the students left, I found my heart hurting for the stresses they wrote down.

I can't remember the amount of times I heard as a youth, "you think things are stressful now, just you wait." While I do long for the stresses of my younger life, I can still recall how frustrating it was to hear that. It's a helpful reminder for us to make sure we're meeting people where they are with empathy and compassion rather than judgement or cynicism. In the silence of the room, I heard God remind me, "what may not seem like a big deal to you is what they were willing to trust me with, can they trust you with it as well?" What a humbling moment. Through being attentive to how God was working in this moment for the youth, there was even something for me.

Throughout the month of October there are many opportunities to get involved here at Grace, to grow in your commitment for God and love of neighbor, and to be attentive to how God is at work. I invite you to join with me in not just adding these events to your calendar, but participating in the ongoing work of God in our midst through the people of Grace United Methodist Church. Enjoy the best (yes it's biased) month of the year!

HOW DO WE RECOGNIZE GOD Del Larson, CLM

Last month, I talked about being reborn in Christ. That means we must give up our life of the past and strive to be more like Christ. We need a spiritual enlightenment and transformation to live a new life in Christ. Well, I've had a couple of enlightening moments and weeks, so this newsletter is another a direct message from **Him**, God, on being like Christ!!

The moment that directed me to this topic, was when I was writing last month's article. The thought passed through my mind and interrupted my writing that I had not seen any writers capitalizing the pronouns used for God. When I started

my writing career back in the 60s, I was taught that the deity pronouns should always be capitalized. So why the change I wondered., I took a break from writing that article to see why writers no longer capitalize God's pronouns. This is one of those "Oh, Wow moments." Here is what I found:

It basically comes down to publishing

houses and printers whether you capitalize pronouns for God. However, one comment really got themselves, rather than those they serve or work me, that said that the only pronoun that is capitalized is the "I". God quickly sent me a news flash as I read that. This is what **He** said about this trag-ready and alert to care for others. Two weeks ago edy, "If it is important to capitalize yourself, don't my kids were telling me to slow down and take you know I am more important, and therefore you care of myself. We should capitalize it as this is **His** work.

Actually, many of the first biblical writers chose to capitalize **His** pronouns. Unfortunately, as translations started to adjust and clarify scripture, rules were changed and other editions failed to capitalize His holy pronoun, and recognize His superior role and to honor **Him** correctly.

Now, it should be pointed out that these scholars may have been too concerned about grammar, but that is an issue for another time. I am sad to say that it was the English that pushed these changes of **Him** to a lower level, rather than continue to raise **HIS** name up to where it belonged. We Methodists had a rather sad part in this terrible injustice when we decided that our famous hymns

would not capitalize **His** pronouns in our music. I am surprised at the actions of John and Charles Wesley, as leaders of the Methodist movement in England and here in America. They should have held their Bible a little closer so He would be recognized for His glory, rather than being concerned about our grammar.

For me, I will continue to capitalized pronouns for God/Christ, and I hope you will too. I figure He deserves not just the credit, but the honor and glory. I pray that this newsletter will hopefully be either a start, or incentive to help you find ways to be closer to God and to serve **Him** to be more like Christ. Is there a kid that loves the outdoors, photography, or cooking? Perhaps someone needs

> help to finish a fall project that can't get done? I know that **He** doesn't forget about those who are lost. **He** is there always, and **He** never gives up on those that struggle. Let's honor God by helping those who feel hopeless and lost.

No one can be wiser than God. We need to follow God's word and do what He wants us to do. We should never put our


